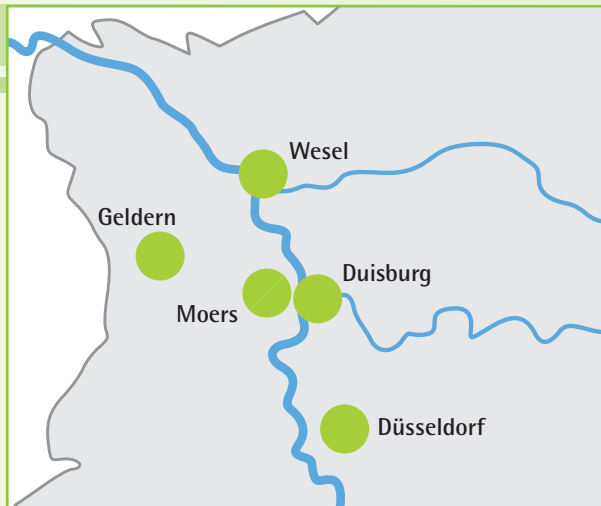


Opstapje
